Our Manager says

Good afternoon and welcome to New Ferens Park and welcome to the players, officials, supporters and management team from our visitors Durham City.

This is the third home game for us in January and I will be happy if we take our total to seven points since the December break this afternoon.

Last Saturday we put in a good all-round performance in the 5-0 win over Darlington Railway Athletic who were not as strong as the side we played earlier in the season.

But if you score five goals, you must be doing something right, and it was nice to see us scoring a few and taking our chances after a frustrating first half to the season in front of goal, in so many games.

We were all delighted for Adam Morley who has had more downs than ups and more stops than starts since joining us and we have not seen that much of him in matches until recent weeks.

He has looked very good on his return to the side, added some serious competition in that position, and it was great to see him scoring his first two goals for the club last week.

Although today's game is of course classed as a derby, just as it is with Durham United, this is simply a game in which we need three points.

We are unbeaten in four in the league now and it is important we keep the momentum going, with continued good results and performances at home in January.

Last weekend's win took us into the second half of the season and we have to have to do better than the first half to demonstrate our progression as a club.

We would like to be a little further forward than we are currently, and, so far, this season has not quite gone as well as we would have liked, or expected, in terms of results.

We find ourselves fifth though and we have had games in hand for some time but they mean nothing if we don't put a run together now.

The barometer of our progression is winning the Wearside League, which is now out of our hands, and we will give everything to finish as high as we can this season and push the four teams above us.

It is well documented that our opponents today are much-changed from the side we beat 15-1 in the Alan Hood Charity Cup here earlier in the season and their results have improved since the turn of the year.

We will face a different challenge in personnel but we know teams coming to New Ferens Park always raise their game.

We have become very good at dealing with that and I expect the same today.

A BRIEF HISTORY...

Formed in 2018, Durham Corinthians compete in the Wearside League Division One and play their home games at New Ferens Park, Belmont.

The club formed to play at New Ferens Park at the start of the 2018/19 season and initially played as Durham United FC, in the Wearside League Development Division, which is now known as Division Two.

Current Manager Dean Smith led the team to three cup finals and finished runners-up in that inaugural season, winning promotion to the first division at their first attempt while also winning the Clem Smith Trophy and the Washington Aged Miner's Cup.

Now becoming Durham Corinthians, the club were competing in Division One for the first time, but the 2019/20 season was curtailed by the Coronavirus pandemic which saw Durham 11th in the table when the season was halted.

Durham Corinthians Reserves formed at the start of that season under manager John Bell who at the end of that season joined Smith and Paul Taylor as a coach in the senior side's management team.

The 2020/21 season was a huge success for Durham Corinthians who finished fourth in Division One having been able to play the full season without feeling the effects of the Coronavirus pandemic.

That season also saw Durham lift the Durham FA Trophy as they beat Darlington Town at Heritage Park, Bishop Auckland's home ground. Durham staged a dramatic comeback after being 1-0 down to then win the game 2-1 and earn their first piece of silverware in four years.

The club currently still play at New Ferens Park and are competing in their second full season in the Wearside League Division One under the management of Smith.

The Club have again applied for promotion into the Northern League for next season showing their continued ambition to play at a higher level.

MATCH PREVIEW...

Durham Corinthians come into this game against Durham City on the back of a comprehensive victory against Darlington RA last Saturday.

Two goals each from Adam Morley and Dan Weaver along with an own goal saw us record our third 5-0 victory of the season after beating Windscale and Shildon Reserves by the same scoreline.

Durham Corinthians are unbeaten in 2023 and are looking to continue to climb the table after this victory took us to a seasons best fifth place in the league.

Our visitors come into this game on the back of a narrow 2-1 defeat against Silksworth. City looked to have held for an unlikely point having played more than half the match with ten men following a sending off, but Silksworth snatched a winner in the 89th minute. City are likely to be without Brandon Gredziak following his red card, but have been making new additions to the squad in recent weeks.

The only previous meeting between the two clubs

was in August 2022 when Durham Corinthians ran out 15-1 winners in the Alan Hood Cup here at New Ferens Park. Durham City have had a change of management since then and will likely be fielding a completely different team to that day.

Durham Corinthians are looking for a victory to continue to close the gap on the top four in the Wearside League whilst the visitors are looking for their first points of the season in what promises to be an exciting encounter at New Ferens Park.

Match Report

Durham Corinthians 5 - 0 Darlington Railway Athletic

Durham Corinthians moved up to fifth place in the Wearside League with a five-star display at New Ferens Park on Saturday.

Defender Adam Morley notched his first two Corinthians goals, both from close range, and Dan Weaver also added a brace, including a penalty, in a 5-0 win over Darlington Railway Athletic who added the fifth with an own goal.

Manager Dean Smith made three changes to the side which drew against Norton and Stockton Ancients last week, with Callum Rowell, Jake Robinson and Cam Arthurs making way for Jordan Harker, Harry Spence and Weaver.

The home side created numerous chances in the opening stages and defender Connor Lyon went closest with a shot from a Max

Stoker knock-down which was turned behind well by visiting goalkeeper Tyler Dickinson who just managed to parry Lyon's well-caught volley from the edge of the box to safety minutes later.



Durham Corinthians opened the scoring on the half-hour mark when Morley bundled home a corner from Matthew Smith, from point blank range, to notch his first goal for the club.

The hosts went very close to doubling their lead when Weaver slammed the ball towards the net from 25-yards but it unluckily came to nothing.

Darlington had to rely on Dickinson on a few occasions before half-time, most notably in a goalmouth scramble which saw efforts from Morley and Lyon both blocked. He also made a good stop to deny Connor Woodford.

After Weaver hit the post from Stoker's inviting through ball, Corinthians finally scored their second when Morley headed home from a Smith corner to give their side a comfortable lead going into the break.

Weaver was brought down in the box immediately after the re-start and then slotted the subsequent penalty down the middle to extend the lead to three.

Ten minutes later, Durham earned their fourth goal of the afternoon, courtesy of an own goal which was turned in by a visiting defender who'd failed to deal

with a quick Smith free-kick.

Corinthians were unlucky not to score a fifth when Smith hammered a free-kick from 30-yards out against the upright.

Manager Smith made his first substitutions when Smith, Woodford and Matthew Halliday were replaced by Steven Telford, Robinson and Arthurs.

The latter substitute very nearly made an instant impact when he flicked the ball over the rushing defender, before driving to the edge of the box and firing an effort just off the post.

With ten minutes to go, Durham made their remaining two changes as both Harker brothers, Josh and Jordan, made way for Rowell and Kieron Richardson.

On 85 minutes, the five-goal rout was completed when Weaver scored his second goal after he collected a loose ball in the box amid confusion from the defence, before coolly slotting into the open net.

The next match sees Smith's squad host a revamped Durham City side, who visit their former home New Ferens Park next Saturday, in a 3pm kick off.

THE CUP WIN...

Almost a year ago, Durham Corinthians won their first piece of silverware lifting the Durham FA Trophy under their new name after defeating Darlington Town at Bishop Auckland's Heritage Park on the 13th March 2022. So, let's look back at Durham's momentous achievement...



A Kieron Richardson equaliser and a screamer from Matthew Smith staged a dramatic comeback after going 1-0 down to 2-1 up and sealed the final for the Belmont-based club in the relentless rain, with club captain Max Stoker lifting the 133-year-old trophy.

It was the first cup Durham Corinthians had won as a Wearside League first division team, and came up against their promotion rivals who took the lead in the second minute.

Dean Smith's side took some time to recover from the early blow after Darlington opened the score-line with the first attack of the game and Steve Johnson was allowed to slip the ball past Durham keeper Matty Wilkinson in the first goalmouth scramble of a game, which was full of them.

Wilkinson immediately made some amends with a brilliant one-handed save from Jim Wilson's curling free-kick at the edge of the penalty area after Dan Weaver and Lewis Rees had squandered a couple of half chances on the difficult surface which took a pounding from rain and wind for almost the entire 90 minutes.

The Durham keeper then made another important stop to deny Darlington centre forward James Beauchamp after his namesake Joe Wilkinson had lost possession outside the box and Harry Spence cleared the danger.

The sides almost headed into the break level but for an excellent save from Darlington keeper Chris Charlton who managed to claw a teasing effort from Matthew Smith to safety after the

Durham midfielder had launched a looping shot goal-ward from Weaver's pass.

Durham's top scorer Kieron Richardson changed the course of the game after another difficult start to the second period, within nine minutes of the re-start, when he steamed into the Darlington area and thumped Tom Young's cross past Charlton from close range through the goalmouth mud for his 13th goal of the season.

And they went ahead just after the hour when Smith attempted another 20 yard shot, this time with the outside of his right boot and his shot flew over Charlton and into the roof of the net.

Although Darlington had one goal ruled out for offside, Durham were more than a match for the late onslaught as both sides made late substitutions with Steven Telford, Ross Tottle and Ryan Bolam all playing important roles, and Cam Arthurs and Marcus Pearce just missing out on the action.

Tottle went close at one end and made a vital block at the other, while Joe Wilkinson also made a crucial clearance in the area in the dying minutes and Matty Wilkinson somehow pulled off a close range reflex save from his goal-line to deny Declan Brown.

That stop helped clinch the Durham Trophy – first won in 1890 by Southwick – for Durham Corinthians and was confirmed when South Shields referee David Carr – who had an excellent game – blew the final whistle.

OUR OPPONENTS...

The original incarnation of Durham City was formed in 1918 and played three seasons in The Victory League, a post war competition.

City were admitted to the Football League and finished a respectable 11th in their first season in the Third Division North. This would prove to be their highest position and in the 1927/28 season they finished 21st and failed to be re-elected to the league, with their place being awarded to Carlisle United. City dropped down to the Wearside League where they played for ten years before disbanding in 1938.

In 1950 the club reformed, joining the Wearside League where they played for two years before moving into the Northern League. In the 1957/58 season they played Tranmere Rovers in the FA Cup, a game which saw a record crowd of 7,000 at Ferens Park.

City won the Northern League in 1993/94 but were unable to take promotion due to issues with their ground. They eventually moved to New Ferens Park in 1995 after a year ground-sharing with Chester Le Street Town but could not repeat their feat of winning the Northern League until the 2007/08 season. This time City did meet the ground requirements and they took their place in the Unibond First Division North for the 2008-09 season. Not satisfied with a season of consolidation, City strengthened their team with a number of former youngsters released from the region's professional ranks and won the Unibond First Division North at their first attempt.

They strengthened further in the close season ahead of their debut season in the Unibond Premier, but were dealt a devastating blow when the administrators announced that City would not be allowed to take up any place in the Conference North or even the Unibond play-offs due to their 3G artificial pitch. They lost

nearly all of their first team players due to a sponsor withdrawing support and after two seasons, they resigned and re-joined the Northern League.

In 2013 the club was bought by ex-Newcastle fullback Olivier Bernard but in 2015 they left New Ferens Park and have spent time ground-sharing at Consett and Willington. After some difficult campaigns City were relegated from the Northern League at the end of last season and after a gap of 70 years, are once again in the earside League playing from Leyburn Grove at Houghton-Le-Spring.

Following a turbulent start to the season on and off the field, City have recently formed a new committee with some old and new faces, and reappointed former manager Wayne Gredziak to run the playing side of things.
