# A BRIEF HISTORY...

**Formed in 2018, Durham Corinthians compete in the Wearside League Division One and play their home games at New Ferens Park, Belmont.**

The club formed to play at New Ferens Park at the start of the 2018/19 season and initially played as Durham United FC, in the Wearside League Development Division, which is now known as Division Two.

Current Manager Dean Smith led the team to three cup finals and finished runners-up in that inaugural season, winning promotion to the first division at their first attempt while also winning the Clem Smith Trophy and the Washington Aged Miner's Cup.

Now becoming Durham Corinthians, the club were competing in Division One for the first time, but the 2019/20 season was curtailed by the Coronavirus pandemic which saw Durham 11th in the table when the season was halted.

Durham Corinthians Reserves formed at the start of that season under manager John Bell who at the end of that season joined Smith and Paul Taylor as a coach in the senior side's management team.

The 2020/21 season was a huge success for Durham Corinthians who finished fourth in Division One having been able to play the full season without feeling the effects of the Coronavirus pandemic.

That season also saw Durham lift the Durham FA Trophy as they beat Darlington Town at Heritage Park, Bishop Auckland's home ground. Durham staged a dramatic comeback after being 1-0 down to then win the game 2-1 and earn their first piece of silverware in four years.

The club currently still play at New Ferens Park and are competing in their second full season in the Wearside League Division One under the management of Smith.

The club have again applied for promotion into the Northern League for next season showing their continued ambition to play at a higher level.

# DEAN SMITH



**Good afternoon and welcome to New Ferens Park and welcome to our visitors Gateshead Leam Rangers and their spectators, players, officials and management team.**

It's great to get a win against Durham City after our defeat to Farringdon Detached last weekend, I felt that we needed a reaction after the Farringdon game as we were very disappointing.

I think that we got that reaction in the City game. It was a good, solid performance and it's obviously great to get another three points.

We had a couple of games cancelled, in particular that Durham City game and they couldn't of come at a worse time for us as we had a bad game at Farringdon so we wanted to get back to winning ways and try to build some momentum again.

I thought that the two goals we scored against Durham City on Wednesday were two really good, well taken goals. The first one was excellent, especially the delivery from Jordan, and we had a few chances like that prior to the goal. Not to mention the timing of Max's run was great!

The second was just a typical Kieron goal! He's phenomenal from left-back to score the number of goals he does. I have to resist the temptation of playing him higher up the pitch because of how many goals he scores.

But I still believe that he gets into those positions better when he actually comes from fullback because the opposition just don't know what to do with him, which showed on Wednesday night at Leyburn Grove.

I've said to the lads, we still have something to play for. I think that we forgot that at Farringdon last week. If you were a neutral watching that game and thought who was the team who had nothing to play for and which is the team still in with a fighting chance, you'd of never have picked us.

So, we've got to get that mentality back because we're running out of games we've been in single figures for a while now, I believe there's only five games left so we have to get the best results from those remaining five games.

It's going to be tough as we haven't been able to train due to playing Durham City on Wednesday. It's unfortunate that we haven't been able to after having a nice run of Saturday fixtures which allowed us to train during the week and then play on the Saturday.

But we have to give a good account of ourselves in this match, it's a huge game against the league leaders. But I think it always favours us when we're at home, with the crowd behind us and playing on a pitch that we enjoy playing on, but it's going to be tough.

They're on a good run of form and they want to go up as well, so we have to pick our side accordingly to be able to test them as much as possible.

## **Durham Corinthians are set to host top of the league Gateshead Leam Rangers at New Ferens Park this Saturday in the Wearside League.**

Leam Rangers look to do the league double over Dean Smith's side having won the reverse fixture 3-1 back in September at Hilltop Playing Field.

The two sides also clashed back in November in the Monkwearmouth Charity Cup first round which seen Leam Rangers go through to the next round after defeating Durham 2-1 at New Ferens Park.

Durham go into today's game on the

back of a 2-0 Durham Derby win after Smith's side defeated bottom of the league Durham City AFC at Leyburn Grove, Houghton-Le-Spring.

Smith's side have only lost one game out of their last 13 league fixtures and were undefeated in 12, with two draws and 10 wins.

Leam Rangers at the time of writing are top of the Wearside League Division and are 13 games unbeaten in the league with five draws and eight wins.

Anthony Huddart will be looking to extend that unbeaten run and will no doubt be continuing to try and cement themselves at the top of the

Wearside League Division One table.

With just six points separating the two sides today, a win for Dean Smith's side could close the gap and keep Durham in the title race.

**Durham Corinthians kept their eyes firmly on the Wearside League's summit with a comfortable victory over their neighbours on Wednesday.**

A goal either side of the half from captain Max Stoker and Kieron Richardson sealed the three points at Leyburn Grove over a much improved City side.

The win confirms Dean Smith's side completed the double over their neighbours, after winning 3-0 at New Ferens Park back in January.

The visitors enjoyed several chances in the opening stages, with the most notable being from Callum Rowell who fired over from range, followed by Richardson dragging a shot wide from the edge of the area moments later.

It was Josh Harker who had an opportunity next, firing a shot wide after driving forward from midfield.

The best chance yet fell to Stoker who was first to meet the ball from a deep corner, but headed just over the target, followed by Jordan Harker sending a similar header wide of the post.

Durham Corinthians kept plugging away at the defence, drawing saves from Liam Peverley in the hosts goal on several occasions before Arthurs struck the side netting with a curled effort.

On 42 minutes, the visitors efforts were rewarded as the deadlock was broken when club captain Stoker notched his

sixth league goal of the campaign, slotting away a low cross from Jordan Harker to take a lead going into the break.

Five minutes after the restart, Richardson once again had an opportunity and narrowly pulled an effort wide.

Just before the hour mark, Durham doubled their lead as Richardson got his name on the scoresheet with a well-taken finish, taking last season's top scorer's tally for this campaign to twelve in all competitions.

The goal came from Smith's side capitalising upon a lapse in concentration for the hosts, allowing a through ball to split open the defence, for Richardson to steer into the far corner of the net.

Harry Renwick was called into action for the first time of the evening when he deflected a close range shot behind with his foot with fifteen minutes to play.

The final chance of the evening fell to Arthurs, who drove at goal by himself, but saw his effort blocked and out for a corner.

The final whistle blew shortly after, confirming Durham were back to winning ways as they moved up to fourth place.

Smith's squad are now six points behind league leaders Gateshead Leam Rangers, who they host on Saturday afternoon.

# **GATESHEAD LEAM RANGERS**

This afternoon, Durham Corinthians are set to take on league leaders Gateshead Leam Rangers Football Club. Leam Rangers at the time of writing are top of the Wearside League Division One table and are nine points ahead of fifth place Durham Corinthians. Leam Rangers play their home games at Hilltop Playing Field, Gateshead. The last time the two sides faced each other was back in the first round of Monkwearmouth Charity Cup back in November last year which ended in a 2-1 defeat to Durham. The last time both the clubs clashed in the league was back in September at Hilltop Playing Field which ended in a 3-1 defeat for Dean Smith's side.

# OUR OPPONENTS...

**Gateshead Leam Rangers was founded in 1993 by Robert Houghton and was originally founded as a youth team.**

Hilltop Playing Field, at the time owned by Gateshead Council, was nothing but an overgrown, unkempt grassed area in.

Hilltop Playing Field was spotted by founder Houghton who had a vision of creating a Youth Football Club at the location and had plans to further improve the site.

The task in hand was to transform an unattended grazing area into a site fit for training and playing football on, while at the same time providing changing facilities, all without any budget or financial assistance.

The desire to improve the club and provide more and better facilities for the children still existed, and the decision to expand was taken.

Further improvement to Hilltop Playing Field followed with a successful application for funding was made to the Football Foundation which seen the current Club House and more changing facilities was built.

The club now boasts some of the best facilities in the area, including a 3G pitch and provides over 300 children with the opportunity to play football in the Gateshead area.

Leam Rangers currently have over 22 teams, have an established a girls section and have senior teams for both Men and Women sections so that junior players are not lost to the club after under-18 level.

The men's senior team have played in the Wearside league Division One since the 2011/12 season.

Leam Rangers have steadily improved year on year, challenging for the Division One title last season having finished in third place just five points behind the Wearside League 2021/22

champions Darlington Town.

The club's only senior trophy came in 2018 when Leam Rangers lifted the Durham FA Trophy.

Leam Rangers faced Northern League side Sunderland West End in the final where after extra time, both sides were unable to break each other down which seen thee game go to penalties.

Leam Rangers won the game on penalties and earned their first ever piece of silverware as a senior football club.

**Previous fixtures between the two clubs have always been a fierce affair, from last minute goals to three red cards in one game.**

Durham are set to face Gateshead Leam Rangers this Saturday, and in this addition of 'From The Archives' we'll be looking at a fixture from last season when Dean Smith's men ran out 3-0 winners against Leam Rangers back in August 2021.

Durham were yet to taste victory after the club suffered an opening day defeat against Darlington Railway at New Ferens Park.

But a Cam Arthurs goal and Michael Ross's brace helped Smith's side pick up their first win of the 2021/22 campaign.

Ross was denied a hat-trick by the visitors' keeper and man of the match Jordan Bolton, who made a string of fine saves to keep the score down.

Ross scored his brace before half-time, poking home after a long throw from Max Stoker before slotting home a lovely second from Tom Young's neat assist before the break.

The home side should have added to their lead in a dominant second period, with Mark Hodgson hardly called upon apart from one save at Robert Houghton's feet and one shot from the Gateshead side which hit the woodwork.

Stoker, Harry Spence and Kieron Richardson all had efforts saved from a series of Young corners.

James Hughes and Steven Telford also went close and Ross was again denied by a good save from Bolton.

But the visitors' keeper was left helpless when substitute Cameron Arthurs launched a 25-yard shot ten minutes from time – much to the nearby James Hughes' chagrin – which he spilled into his own net.
