OUR HISTORY...









Newcastle Blue Star Football Club were orignially formed in 1930, before the club vanished in the 2008/09 season and reforming in 2018 to play their home games at the Scotswood Sports Centre.

Blue Star originally joined the Wearside League back in 1973 and won the FA Vase in 1978. Blue Star played most of their games at the Wheatsheaf Ground, known as Druid Park in the west of the city, and at Kingston Park which is now the home of Rugby Union club the Newcastle Falcons.

Blue Star soon won promotion to the Northern Premier League but with some off-field trouble, it resulted in the collapse of the football club.

Now, Newcastle Blue Star Football Club is one of the fastest growing amateur football clubs in the North East of England, with the goal of bringing success back to a historic football club and have ambitions of becoming a key club in the city.

The club is based in the West End of Newcastle upon Tyne and is currently playing in the Northern League Division Two.

As well as the first team, Blue Star have a reserve squad who are competing in the Northern Football Alliance Second Division and have numerous youth teams.

The first season in Northern Alliance seen the first team finish third in the league. The 2022/23 season was a huge success as Blue Star won the Premier Division and lifted the 132-year-old trophy.

After the success of last season, Blue Star soon earned promotion into the Northern League Division Two for the 2023/24 season.

With vital support from 1978 FA Vase winners Paul Dixon and Ian Crumplin the club like to get as much support as possible from you. Together, hopefully we can have more Wembley moments to enjoy!

relegation to the tenth tier
in 2015/16.

The Terriers are on an upward trajectory back to the first division after finishing in third place last season, only one point behind Horden and four points behind the league winners Boro Rangers.

Andy Ferguson's side have had a great start to this campaign too, with a trio of victories to start against Billingham, Chester-le-Street and Thornaby before only narrowly losing 3-2 to Boldon last time out.

It's certainly going to be a great test for us when the Northumberland

natives visit Scotswood, and they will provide tough competition in all areas of the pitch.

Until their last outing, the Terriers had only conceded one goal so will be hard to break down this evening.

The team is a young outfit with 60% (12/20) of the players under the age of or of the age of 21.

The club captain Sam Dinsley has been described as a versatile midfielder who can play in several positions, and today is his 22nd birthday.

Their goalkeeper is Adam Cameron, a 21-year-old shot-stopper who has been at Gateshead and most recently Sunderland's academy set up, who the Terriers snapped him up from.

Their star player to watch out for is striker Joseph Thompson, who has

already notched three goals this season in the league and will look to add to that tally when the 23-year-olds team visit this evening.
