OUR HISTORY...









Newcastle Blue Star Football Club were orignially formed in 1930, before the club vanished in the 2008/09 season and reforming in 2018 to play their home games at the Scotswood Sports Centre.

Blue Star originally joined the Wearside League back in 1973 and won the FA Vase in 1978. Blue Star played most of their games at the Wheatsheaf Ground, known as Druid Park in the west of the city, and at Kingston Park which is now the home of Rugby Union club the Newcastle Falcons.

Blue Star soon won promotion to the Northern Premier League but with some off-field trouble, it resulted in the collapse of the football club.

Now, Newcastle Blue Star Football Club is one of the fastest growing amateur football clubs in the North East of England, with the goal of bringing success back to a historic football club and have ambitions of becoming a key club in the city.

The club is based in the West End of Newcastle upon Tyne and is currently playing in the Northern League Division Two.

As well as the first team, Blue Star have a reserve squad who are competing in the Northern Football Alliance Second Division and have numerous youth teams.

The first season in Northern Alliance seen the first team finish third in the league. The 2022/23 season was a huge success as Blue Star won the Premier Division and lifted the 132-year-old trophy.

After the success of last season, Blue Star soon earned promotion into the Northern League Division Two for the 2023/24 season.

With vital support from 1978 FA Vase winners Paul Dixon and Ian Crumplin the club like to get as much support as possible from you. Together, hopefully we can have more Wembley moments to enjoy!

The Northern League returned to the West End in style on Tuesday night, with Newcastle Blue Star coming from behind to win 2-1 against Yarm & Eaglescliffe.

Fresh from an opening day thriller, Blue Star entered the game hoping to build on their opening day 3-2 victory at Jarrow, last Saturday. Yarm meanwhile would have hoped to bounce back after a 3-0 defeat at the hands of Prudhoe.

The home side started the brighter of the two sides with them

dominating most of the ball early on.

Despite 'The Star' controlling the affair in the early stages, they struggled to find the killer pass needed.

This would eventually come back to bite them as they would fall behind in the 27th minute, with the Yarm number four heading home from a corner.

Following the goal, Yarm would push for a late equaliser but Blue Star would hold strong and ultimately come away with all three points - making it back-to-back wins to start the season for Brian Smith's side.

'We may even have seen the Goal of the Season competition being closed after only one game as well as Aaron 'AJ' Jervis' strike from fully 35 yards smashed in to the 'top bins' for a spectacular equaliser. Unfortunately it wasn't enough to earn us a point.'
