PROUD OF OUR

BLYTH SPARTANS WERE FOUNDED IN 1899 BY FRED STOKER WHO NAMED THE CLUB AFTER THE GREEK SPARTANS ARMY IN THE HOPE THAT THE PLAYERS WOULD GIVE THEIR ALL AS THEY WENT INTO "BATTLE" ON THE FIELD.

THE CLUB PLAYED FRIENDLY GAMES FOR THE FIRST FEW YEARS OF ITS EXISTENCE BEFORE JOINING THE EAST NORTHUMBERLAND LEAGUE IN 1901 WHERE THEY WON THE LEAGUE ON THEIR FIRST ATTEMPT.

THE CLUB MOVED UPWARD JOINING THE RANKS OF THE SEMI-PROFESSIONALS IN THE NORTHEASTERN LEAGUE AND REMAINED THERE UNTIL THE LEAGUE FOLDED IN 1958.

THE GREEN ARMY'S MOST FAMOUS SEASON IS UNDOUBTLY WHEN THEY REACHED THE FIFTH ROUND OF THE FA CUP DURING THE 1977-78 CAMPAIGN.

GOING UP AGAINST WREXHAM, SPARTANS DREW 1-1 IN THE FIRST LEG WITH A REPLAY TOOK PLACE AT NEWCASTLE UNITED'S ST JAMES' PARK, IN FRONT OF A CROWD OF 42,167 PEOPLE BEFORE EVENTUALLY BOWING OUT OF THE CUP LOSING 2-1 BUT WAS A TRULY HISTORIC DAY FOR THE CLUB.

IN OCTOBER 2004, SPARTANS APPOINTED HARRY DUNN AS MANAGER FOR THE SECOND TIME AND LED THE CLUB TO WIN THE NORTHERN PREMIER LEAGUE PREMIER DIVISION, GAINING PROMOTION INTO THE CONFERENCE NORTH (NOW KNOWN AS NATIONAL LEAGUE NORTH).

IN THEIR FIRST SEASON IN THE CONFERENCE NORTH, BLYTH CEMENTED THEMSELVES IN THE TOP HALF OF THE TABLE WITH THE CLUB NARROWLY MISSING OUT ON A PLAY-OFF POSITION ON THE FINAL DAY AND FINISHING 7TH.

BLYTH STRUGGLED TO FIND SIMILAR FORM IN THE FOLLOWING FEW YEARS, WITH WINS TOWARDS THE END OF THE SEASON PRESERVING THEIR CONFERENCE NORTH STATUS FOR THE NEXT TWO SEASONS.

IN THE 2008-09 SEASON, BLYTH HIT ANOTHER CUP RUN WITH BLYTH GETTING THROUGH TO THE THIRD ROUND OF THE FACUP WITH WINS AGAINST SHREWSBURY TOWN AND AFC BOURNEMOUTH PUT BLYTH THROUGH TO THE THIRD ROUND.

BLYTH'S FA CUP DREAM SOON ENDED IN THE THIRD ROUND AFTER COMING UP AGAINST PREMIER LEAGUE BLACKBURN ROVERS FOR THE FIRST TIME IN THE CLUBS HISTORY BEFORE BOWING OUT OF THE COMPETION IN 1-0 DEFEAT.

HOWEVER, AFTER 113 YEARS THE GREEN ARMY SUFFERED THEIR FIRST EVER RELEGATION IN THE 2011-12 SEASON AND WERE RELEGATED FROM THE CONFERENCE NORTH AFTER A 1-0 HOME DEFEAT TO GLOUCESTER CITY.

THE CLUB APPOINTED TOM WADE AS MANAGER AND ONCE AGAIN HAD A FA CUP FAIRYTALE IN 2014 AFTER BEATING LEAGUE TWO SIDE HARTLEPOOL UNITED.

STEPHEN TURNBULL'S MAGNIFICENT FREE-KICK AND A LATE WINNER FROM JARRETT RIVERS STAGED A DRAMATIC AND HISTORIC COMEBACK FOR SPARTANS AND THE GAME WAS SHOWN LIVE ON THE BBC.

ONCE AGAIN, THE GREEN ARMY BOWED OUT OF THE CUP IN THE THIRD ROUND AFTER ROBBIE DALE'S FIRST HALF BRACE WASN'T ENOUGH AS BIRMINGHAM CITY SCORED THREE GOALS IN SIX MINUTES TO END THE NORTH EAST SIDES HOPES OF REACHING THE FOURTH ROUND.

IN THE 2015-16, SPARTANS NARROWLY MISSED OUT ON PROMOTION AFTER FINISHING SECOND IN THE NORTHERN PREMIER LEAGUE PREMIER DIVISION BEFORE BEING DEFEATED BY WORKINGTON AFC IN THE PLAY-OFFS.

BLYTH APPOINTED ALUN ARMSTRONG AS MANAGER AND THAT FOLLOWING SEASON WITH ARMSTRONG LEADING BLYTH TO THE NORTHERN PREMIER LEAGUE TITLE WITH 101 POINTS.

IN THE 2018-19 SEASON, BLYTH FINISHED IN THEIR HIGHEST EVER NATIONAL LEAGUE NORTH POSITION IN SIXTH PLACE AND IN A PLAY-OFF SPOT. HOWEVER, THE GREEN ARMY WERE DEFEATED IN THE PLAY-OFFS AFTER LOSING 7-6 ON PENALTIES TO ALTRINCHAM.

THE CLUB ARE NOW UNDER THE MANAGEMENT OF GRAHAM FENTON FOR THE 2023/24 SEASON AND ARE CURRENTLY COMPETING IN THE VANARAMA NATIONAL LEAGUE NORTH.

THE MANAGER GRAHAM FENTON



Hello everyone and welcome back to Croft Park this afternoon as we host Bradford (Park Avenue) in the Emirates FA Cup.

Looking back on Farsley Celtic game, I was really impressed. We moved the ball around really well and created some great chances. Although it's nice to score four goals, I was mostly impressed with how defensively solid we were.

Farsley have some decent forward players who cause problems, so I thought we dealt with them very well. Particularly in the second half as we controlled the game.

I think what made the performance

even better was the fact Farsley had only been beaten once this season and only conceded six goals. To put four past them and win the way we did was something I was really proud and impressed with from the lads.

I didn't feel like the Chester game was anything like the Boston game. Yes, we weren't at our best for the Chester game, we weren't necessarily bad but we just didn't get to the levels we needed to in order to deserve a win, but I also thought we didn't deserve to lose.

I thought it was extremely disappointing to get decision like that against us in that game (the Chester match).

When a referee makes a decision like what he did at the end of a match,

it has to be one hundred percent a penalty.

I can tell you; it wasn't one hundred percent a penalty. Especially because it wasn't just us saying that, the Chester players and their staff also said it wasn't a penalty. If they're saying it's not, then does that not tell you something? I don't know if he was trying to make up for the penalty decision earlier, maybe? Blyth Spartans are set to kick off their first Emirates FA Cup fixture of the 2023/24 campaign as they host Northern Premier League Premier Division side Bradford (Park Avenue) at Croft Park.

The nations oldest football competition is one that is deep rooted in Blyth Spartans' history with cup runs in the 70s, early and late 2000s.

This FA Cup Second Qualifying Round sees Spartans face up against Northern Premier League side Bradford (Park Avenue) a club who were relegated from the National League North last season on the last game of the season.

Although this is the opening game for Blyth in the FA Cup, this is Park Avenue's second game of the competition having defeated Consett in a 2-0 away victory in the First Qualifying Round.

Park Avenue currently sit 16th in the Northern Premier League Premier Division table after seven games with two wins, two draws and three defeats this season.

The club were defeated 2-0 in their last fixture what was an away match against FC United of Manchester.

Spartans currently sit sixth in the National League North table after nine games with five wins and four losses this season and in Blyth's most recent fixture, they were defeated 2-1 away to Chester.

However, Blyth this season are undefeated on home turf with the club running out 4-0 winners the last time they played at Croft Park when they defeated Farsley Celtic.

Spartans have also only beaten Park Avenue once out of the four fixtures played at Croft Park which was back in 2018 when Blyth ran out 3-0 winners.



MATCHDAY ROLE

TO CELEBRATE THE HARD WORK OF OUR STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS AT BLYTH SPARTANS, THIS NEW SERIES GIVES THE DEDICATED STAFF OF OUR FOOTBALL CLUB A PLATFORM TO TALK ABOUT THEIR ROLE. PHIL CASTIAUX SPOKE TO CLUB PHYSIO OSCAR PEVERLEY ABOUT RECENTLY JOINING THE CLUB. GRADUATING FROM UNIVERSITY. AND HOW HE GOT THE ROLE:

Speaking on where his passion grew from to be involved in physiotherapy:

"I remember watching the 'All or Nothing' Manchester City documentary and from there it made me really want to pursue a career in physiotherapy in the sports industry, especially in football. Seeing the relationships and the dynamics between the players, coaches and other back-room staff was something that I really wanted to be a part of and see myself doing.

"From there, I tried looking into who the back-room staff were at Manchester City to reach out to them and researched other clubs who had their staff names or contacts available for me to get in touch with.

"I must've sent over 100 emails to practitioners and staff members who worked for football clubs up and down the country for advice. I got some good responses and pieces of advice to help guide me into the direction that I wanted to go."

When discussing study life, comparing his role at the Club, and how he landed the job, and how he landed the job, Oscar said:

"I graduated recently from Teesside University with a first-class honour in physiotherapy and starting this month I'll be studying part-time doing my masters degree in sports and exercise medicine. However, anyone who's done this role before will tell you that you'll never know everything, so you've got to focus on your development and understanding of the subject in your own time.

"So, with doing physiotherapy it's a little bit different to sport physiotherapy as you would cover topics about working with elderly, amputees and cardiovascular and raspatory patients. A lot of that is worlds away from my day-to-day role at Blyth, it's not really where my passion is because of my love for sport but I must still learn about it because I need to know it to get to the position that I am in now.

"Before I got the Spartans role, I worked alongside Gary Neasham previously during his role at Park View Academy in Sport where I done some voluntary work alongside my university studies. Speaking to Gary at the Senior Cup final he mentioned to me about a potential role coming up.

"We spoke a lot during the summer regarding the role and I was initially worried that my studies for my masters degree down in Nottingham would get in the way of my role at Blyth, so I ended up coming in during pre-season to help while they were looking for someone to bring in for the physio role full-time.

"Thankfully, speaking to the university I was able to move a few things around on the degree programme so that it meant that I was able to do both."

Oscar concluded with comments on the contemporary extended additional time on fixtures as well as his views on the lads' ethics within preparing and recovering pre- and post-matchdays:

"In regard to what is happening in football right now with the extended periods in added time some upwards to reaching 100 minutes of football played. It's something that I think is very worrying.

"But I think although this is worrying time for every football club up and down the footballing pyramid, we've got a good group of lads here who know how to look after themselves and recover well so as long as we keep doing what we're doing now and helping each other we will be fine."





BROADCAST LIVE ON ESPN, BLYTH
SPARTANS RECREATED HISTORY WHEN
THEY FACED RYAN REYNOLDS' AND ROB
MCELHENNY'S WREXHAM AFC IN THE FA CUP
FOURTH ROUND OUALIFYING LAST SEASON.

Michael Richardson's last gasp freekick earned Spartans a replay at the Racecourse Ground in a hard-fought FA Cup tie.

This fixture seen a packed out Croft Park with 2,787 spectators in attendance and thousands watching live from the United States of America to watch another Blyth Spartans FA Cup upset.

Wrexham, a familiar side in Blyth's history, traveled to Northumbria as favourites due to being a division higher at the time and chasing for promotion into the Football League.

Spartan fans will already know about the famous FA Cup game back in 1978 when Wrexham faced Blyth at St James' Park in the fifth round of one of the worlds oldest cup competitions, having forced a replay the previous game in a 1-1 draw at the Racecourse Ground.

After a battling opening 20 minutes from both sides, but it was Wrexham who had the best chance with a looping effort from the wing by Sam Dalby which bounced on the bar and out of play.



Blyth had a fantastic opportunity to go ahead just before the break when a deep cross was played into the far post by Liam Ravenhill to pick out JJ O'Donnell who nodded the ball just wide of goal.

The first goal of the game came with just 15 minutes left of the game when a Tom O'Connor free kick from just outside the box took a deflection off the wall and bounced into the top right corner of the net to give the Welsh side the lead.

However, Spartans continued to battle on and eventually brought the game level when a freekick from the left hand side was driven in by former Newcastle United youth player Richardson.

The ball bounced through the crowded penalty area and past a bemused Howard in goal to level the score line. Croft Park erupted when the ball hit the back of the net and all of a sudden Blyth Spartans supporters dared to dream.

After a nervy final few minutes, the referee brought the game to a close with Blyth impressing throughout the 90 minutes.

Spartans earned themselves a replay in Wales, however after a valiant display bringing the score line on the day from 3-0 down to 3-2, Graham Fenton's side were unable to beat a well drilled Wrexham side on the day and bowed out of the FA Cup.

Bradford (Park Avenue) Association Football Club was formed in 1907 and used the name of its old ground, Park Avenue, to distinguish itself from Bradford City AFC.

The club moved from the Southern League into the Football League the next year after forming.

They were promoted into the First Division at the end of the 1913–14 season, but suffered consecutive relegations by 1922. Park Avenue won the Third Division North title in 1927–28 and remained in the Second Division until 1950.

Promoted from the Fourth Division in 1960–61, the club were relegated from the Third Division in 1963. The club failed in their Football League re-election bid in 1970 and spent the next four seasons in the Northern Premier League before disbanding.

The present club is a reincarnation that was established in 1987. They moved from the Central Midlands League into the North West Counties League in 1990, gaining promotion from Division Two in 1990–91.

They moved into their present home at

Horsfall Stadium in 1996 having previously won the North West Counties League Division One title, and then the Northern Premier League Premier Division in 2000–01.

Relegated in two successive seasons in 2006, they won the Northern Premier League First Division title in 2007–08 and gained promotion from the Premier Division via the play-offs in 2012 after beating FC United of Manchester 1-0 to be promoted into the Conference North.

In February 2008, chief executive Bob Blackburn unveiled plans for a 20,000-seat stadium at Phoenix Park in Thornbury, within the Leeds metropolitan district, but the site had to be sold before this was realised.

After over a decade in the National League North, the club were relegated last season into the Northern Premier League Premier Division on the final day of the season.

Bower was first appointed manager for Park Avenue back in 2016 and left the club in May 2019 before re-joining the club in the October that same year.

Lucas Odunston's journey with Park Avenue began two years ago when he made the move from Hull u21s. Since then, the defender has demonstrated tremendous growth making 29 appearances in his first season followed by 38 in the 22/23 Season.



JAMIE SPENCER

Jamie Spencer re-joined the club last season from Guiseley and finished up playing over 30 games while bagging goal of the season in the process with his effort from the halfway line against Scarborough.



WILL LONGROTTOM

Park Avenue front man Will Longbottom joined the club during the end of the 2020/21 season. The centre-forward was Avenue's top goalscorer last season with 11 goals in 42 games in the National League North.
