OUR HISTORY...









Newcastle Blue Star Football Club were orignially formed in 1930, before the club vanished in the 2008/09 season and reforming in 2018 to play their home games at the Scotswood Sports Centre.

Blue Star originally joined the Wearside League back in 1973 and won the FA Vase in 1978. Blue Star played most of their games at the Wheatsheaf Ground, known as Druid Park in the west of the city, and at Kingston Park which is now the home of Rugby Union club the Newcastle Falcons.

Blue Star soon won promotion to the Northern Premier League but with some off-field trouble, it resulted in the collapse of the football club.

Now, Newcastle Blue Star Football Club is one of the fastest growing amateur football clubs in the North East of England, with the goal of bringing success back to a historic football club and have ambitions of becoming a key club in the city.

The club is based in the West End of Newcastle upon Tyne and is currently playing in the Northern League Division Two.

As well as the first team, Blue Star have a reserve squad who are competing in the Northern Football Alliance Second Division and have numerous youth teams.

The first season in Northern Alliance seen the first team finish third in the league. The 2022/23 season was a huge success as Blue Star won the Premier Division and lifted the 132-year-old trophy.

After the success of last season, Blue Star soon earned promotion into the Northern League Division Two for the 2023/24 season.

With vital support from 1978 FA Vase winners Paul Dixon and Ian Crumplin the club like to get as much support as possible from you. Together, hopefully we can have more Wembley moments to enjoy!

Newcastle Blue continued their perfect start to the Northern League season, with a comfortable 5-0 victory against Washington.

Early first-half goals from youngster Alfie Livermore and Nelson Ogbewe put Blue Star ahead early on. 'The Star' would then extend their lead in the second half through Michael Richardson and a brace from Harvey Walsh.

Currently unbeaten this season, Blue Star arrived at Washington as strong favourites, especially with the home side having failed to win a single game so far this season.

Blue Star continued their recent

trend of scoring early and took the lead in the 4th minute - with Ogbewe smartly squaring it to Livermore, who slotted home into an empty net.

'The Star' would continue their electric start to the game, grabbing another goal in the 16th minute, with Ogbewe turning from provider to goal scorer, calmly slotting his effort through the goalkeeper's legs.

Following the second goal, Washington seemed to toughen up defensively, not allowing Blue Star as much freedom in the final third.

Blue Star however would still have chances to further extend their lead before the break, with Walsh coming close. Ultimately though the score would remain 2-0 at half-time.

The start of the second half would see Blue Star's goal hunt continue. Scoring their 3rd in the 55th minute, with Walsh's cross falling at the feet of Richardson, whose shot found the bottom corner.

It seemed as if the game would peter out at 3-0 but following a number of changes, Blue Star would once again turn on the style. Scoring a fourth in the 75th minute with Walsh firing his shot through the legs of the Washington goalkeeper.

Walsh would again be on the goal train just four minutes later, with his mazy run in behind the Washington defence resulting in him slotting home into the bottom corner and Blue star coming away with a 5-0 victory.

Redcar Town men's team was formed in 2014 and entered the Teesside League Second Division.

Ex proffessional player Roy Hunter and experienced Northern League player Craig Gibbin were at the helm and took the team to the Second Division title losing only one game.

The team also added the Burness Plate and the McMillan Bowl beating First Division Champions Whinney Banks 3-1 in the Final at Guisborough Town.

Only two players from that first season are still with the team James Smuk, and Sam Wheatley who all played in that Final.

The following season Redcar ran two teams with the Senior side

playing in the Teesside League and the reserve team playing in the Durham Alliance League.

The Senior team won the JV Madden Trophy which was the annual curtain raiser between previous League champions and the McMillan Bowl winners again beating Whinney Banks 3-0 at Thornaby FC.

The team has been prominent members of the Teesside League/North Riding Premier Division since being formed winning the 2017 Lou Moore Trophy against B.E.A.D.S 4-2 aet at Thornaby FC.

We have built our ground into one of the best facilities in the area and have staged Cup Finals for the TJFA and the North Riding Girls League as well as both the North Riding Football League and County FA.

In 2021 the club applied for promotion to the Northern League for the first time and after a successful ground grading inspection were informed that our bid had been successful.

In our first season in the Northern in a credible 10th place proving to be highly competitive. The team followed this up with an improved seventh placing last season and are once again looking to improve upon this with a another competitive effort from the players with a play off spot the target.
