OUR HISTORY...









Newcastle Blue Star Football Club were orignially formed in 1930, before the club vanished in the 2008/09 season and reforming in 2018 to play their home games at the Scotswood Sports Centre.

Blue Star originally joined the Wearside League back in 1973 and won the FA Vase in 1978. Blue Star played most of their games at the Wheatsheaf Ground, known as Druid Park in the west of the city, and at Kingston Park which is now the home of Rugby Union club the Newcastle Falcons.

Blue Star soon won promotion to the Northern Premier League but with some off-field trouble, it resulted in the collapse of the football club.

Now, Newcastle Blue Star Football Club is one of the fastest growing amateur football clubs in the North East of England, with the goal of bringing success back to a historic football club and have ambitions of becoming a key club in the city.

The club is based in the West End of Newcastle upon Tyne and is currently playing in the Northern League Division Two.

As well as the first team, Blue Star have a reserve squad who are competing in the Northern Football Alliance Second Division and have numerous youth teams.

The first season in Northern Alliance seen the first team finish third in the league. The 2022/23 season was a huge success as Blue Star won the Premier Division and lifted the 132-year-old trophy.

After the success of last season, Blue Star soon earned promotion into the Northern League Division Two for the 2023/24 season.

With vital support from 1978 FA Vase winners Paul Dixon and Ian Crumplin the club like to get as much support as possible from you. Together, hopefully we can have more Wembley moments to enjoy!

Newcastle Blue Star returned to winning ways coming from behind to win 4-1 against Newcastle University.

Goals from Paul Robinson, Nelson Ogbewe, Michael Richardson, and an own goal from the University goalkeeper handed 'the Star' their first win in three games.

Blue Star made the trip to Essity Park looking to put their run of winless games behind them, having failed to win since their 5-0 thumping of Washington back in August.

Both sides would start the game in quick fashion, with it being very end-to-end early on. Newcastle Uni though would be the ones to strike first, with their number nine curling a beautiful effort into the top corner from around 30 yards out, to give his side the lead in the 18th minute.

Going behind seemed to kick Blue Star into action, immediately replying with a goal of their own in the 23rd minute. Robinson would be the man to get his side level, firing a left-footed shot into the bottom corner.

The home side however would nearly fire themselves back into the lead just four minutes later, with their number nine hitting the crossbar then somehow missing the rebound from two yards out.

Despite both sides having chances before the break, the score would remain 1-1 at half-time.

Clearly frustrated by their sloppy first-half performance, Blue Star came out in the second half looking to right the wrongs of the first. They would do exactly that just five minutes into the second half when Craig McFarlane's cross found Ogbewe at the back post, who tapped home into an empty net.

'The Star' however would not stop there, scoring a third goal in the 54th minute, thanks to a rather odd own goal by the Newcastle Uni goalkeeper – in which he somehow punched the ball into his own net.

It seemed as if the game would peter out at 3-1 but Blue Star midfielder, Richardson, would have other ideas, curling a beautiful free kick into the bottom corner in the 90th minute – to round off an impressive comeback by 'The Star'.

INTRODUCING OUR OPPOSITION...



Chester-le-Street United was formed during the lockdown of 2020 and comprises of one of the most forward-thinking football clubs in Chester-le-Street working in partnership with Park View Academy of Sport.

United was formed by John Gamble and Lewis Pendleton to create a pathway for the club's academy.

Having ran an Under 19 programme playing age group football, Gamble and Pendleton thought the best possible pathway for the young players to get into professional football was to give expose to senior football at the mens level

The club then formed a senior side to play at the Park View Academy of Sport to enhance opportunities that lead to professional football.

While the club's first season was curtailed due to the continuing pandemic it from being a successful one.

The County Durham club reached the semi-final of the Durham Challenge cup and went on to beat Boldon CA in the final of Alan Hood Cup to achieve the first club's first ever piece of silverware.

The County Durham club continued winning silverware, as in their second season after winning the Monkwearmouth Charity Cup and promotion to the Ebac Northern League.

United had an excellent first season in the Northern League Second Division finishing 12th in the league.

The club prides itself on giving young players an opportunity to test themselves in the men's game and all their squad for the forthcoming season are aged 19 and under.

The club are now looking to consolidate and push on this season as well as looking to parade their new project in The FA Vase and FA Youth Cup where the majority of the club's first-team squad are eligible to play in.
